

For many years we have fund raised for River House and our committee wants to continue to support this mission

for local homeless women. River House is part of Lifebridge and has offered shelter to women since 2023 in addition to support services to assist residents as they get back on their feet with employment, health care and meeting other basic needs.

We are collecting hygiene items including:

A New Series on Trusting Our Bodies When it Comes to the Food we Eat is Coming to FBC This Fall!


Join Abby Sykes for a two-class series exploring intuitive eating and our relationship to and with food.




