




Swing by after school or work Friday afternoon/evening and **help transform the church into a Fair Winter Wonderland**. Pizza will be served Friday night to helpers!

Spotlight On Stewardship: Week 2 of the FBC Beverly Pledge Drive






We are collecting hygiene items including:
