
Worship With Us! Sunday, November 7, at First Baptist Church



Grown-Up Field Trip! Mark Your Calendar for Sunday, November 13th

Join with your friends at FBC on a learning adventure to Newburyport, where we will see and experience first-hand the transformative work of Swords to Plowshares (S2P).

S2P partners with police departments conducting gun buyback programs In Connecticut and elsewhere in New England. Once the collected weapons have been processed and designated for destruction, they are turned over to S2P to be reforged into gardening tools by volunteer blacksmiths, often working alongside prisoners in participating prisons or exconvicts in community re-entry programs. The finished tools are then donated to community gardens and agricultural high schools, or they are sold in the S2P store.

The demonstration event with S2P will feature a portable forge, affording us a chance to learn more about the program, watch a real blacksmith at work, and even try our own hands at fashioning a piece of glowing metal into something beautiful and life-giving!


Transportation is available, or you can drive yourself. We will plan to depart from the church parking lot at 12:15 pm, and our estimated return time is 4:15 pm.

Corporate Responsibility and the Global Economy November 2021

The impact of the First Baptist Church in Beverly within the national and world economy has been largely pursued through the efforts of its investment managers. These efforts embraced an initial focus upon the selection of securities deemed supportive of our social Policy Guidelines, now expanded into an active engagement with company management to secure changes in business operations which comply with sound environmental, social welfare, and governance policies.

In our previous article, we introduced Boston Common Asset Management and the priorities which shape our mutual shared investment strategy. At this time, we wanted to briefly illustrate how Boston Common has exercised this strategy within our world economy. Specifically, Boston Common reports the following accomplishments:

• In Mexico:

Food multinational Grupo Bimbo is now better classifying the nutritional value of its product and reformulation efforts, and we are now focused on helping the company to minimize deforestation risks related to soy in the Amazon.

• In the United Kingdom:

Financial giant Standard Chartered has improved its climate risk reporting and strategy, including the creation of a group-level Climate Change Working Group and stopping direct coal-fired power plants.

• In Spain:

Melia became the first hotel chain to sign an agreement with the IUF labor union to prevent workplace sexual harassment and has implemented a more robust approach to human rights.

• In China:

BEWG Beijing Enterprise Water Group has improved its disclosure on risks by responding to a Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) water questionnaire. (Further analysis of this investment and related supportive claims will be provided in a subsequent article.)

• In Indonesia:

We engaged Bank Rakyat on low carbon banking and advised the bank to ask its clients to adopt RoundTable on Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO) best practices.

• In Japan:

Hoya (Healthcare) and Orix (finance) both worked with us to map and assess their sustainability management and subsequently formed ESG Committees to drive best practice.

• In Taiwan:

Taiwan Semiconductor now has plans to improve its public reporting on recycling plastic waste.
