
#### Worship With Us!

#### **American Baptist Churches!**



From June 21 through June 26, I had the pleasure of hanging out in San Juan, Puerto Rico, for the Biennial Mission Summit of the American Baptist Churches, USA (ABCUSA). Interspersed with the regular events of the Summit was a program named "Engage 2023!"—a series of sessions designed to familiarize American Baptist seminary students, ministers new to the ABCUSA (like me!), and select lay leaders with the ins and outs of American Baptist life. As a participant in that program, my hotel and meal costs were covered by the ABCUSA, while FBC Beverly graciously agreed to pay my airfare to get there (and back!).

I came away from the Engage program, and indeed from the whole Summit experience, with a deeper understanding of the sprawling network of organizations operating under

the American Baptist banner. Feel free to quiz me sometime on the dizzying array of acronyms and initialisms used to identify those organizations—OGS and BGM, IM and ABHMS (not to be confused with the ABHS!), GLCC and the CECL, ABEC and MMBB, etc., along with our Puerto Rican hosts from IBPR. I may even be able to tell you a little about what each of those organizations does and how they all relate to one another!

I also came away from my time in Puerto Rico with an appreciation for the wide variety of churches and people that freely associate with the ABCUSA. Numerous speakers over the weekend saw fit to mention that the ABCUSA is the most ethnically, culturally, and politically diverse denomination in the United States. This observation was invariably a point of pride for those who made it, but it was also reflected practically in the disposition seemingly adopted by most of the Summit attendees. Even where attendees differed greatly in theological, cultural, and political orientation, exchanges between them were generally marked by a spirit of respectful dialogue and a desire for mutual understanding.

The four plenary worship services over the weekend featured preachers who spoke in unapologetically prophetic fashion about the need for the Christian church to work actively to undo unjust and oppressive social systems. Quite to my own surprise, I found myself moved by each of them.

Two other highlights from the weekend came in smaller sessions hosted by the ABC Creation Justice Network and the Association of Welcoming and Affirming Baptists (AWAB). First Baptist Church in Beverly was actually singled out by name in each of these sessions for significant efforts that have advanced the causes of each group. The Creation Justice event highlighted (with pictures!) the solar array that we have installed on the roof the church building, while FBC Beverly was identified among the earliest affiliates of AWAB at its founding some 30 years ago. The AWAB session was an especially celebratory affair, as it marked the first time in history that AWAB was actually allowed to meet in the same convention center as the Summit and have its gathering listed as part of the regular Summit program.

To be sure, denominational relations can often breed a great deal of tension and discord. Given the size and composition of the ABCUSA, there are bound to be times when decisions that are made on behalf of the whole will rub particular member churches the wrong way. Yet at a time when many denominations in the United States are breaking apart or actively purging themselves of elements judged to be too progressive, the current trajectory of the ABCUSA strikes me as an especially hopeful one. Voluntarily bound together in mission, the American Baptist Churches of the USA continue to share the love of God while actively working to effect positive social change. And FBC Beverly continues to play a significant role in helping to make that happen.

# Harborlight Nursery School continues to flourish FBC: Presenting the NEW logo and website!

When you speak with Billie Jean Chouinard, the Director of Harborlight Nursery School who celebrates one year at the helm this July, it's hard NOT to get excited about the program & the students! Billie Jean credits her team and the board of HNS, but if you see her around FBC and have the chance to chat, you'll see just what I mean. In her short time as the Director she's already worked to redesign the HNS logo AND the website, which is due to launch in the next few weeks. The School Family is very happy with the look and feel of the new website, especially the functionality elements added for incoming families.

Harborlight Nursery School's reputation proceeds it due to the play-based learning strategy. Educators mindfully, meaningfully and deliberately work to deliver lessons in a play format. Everything is delivered in a "joyful format for learning" so that it feels like students are playing, when in actuality they are exploring science or literacy, for example. Studies show that the approach is the best way for students to learn and the ultimate goal is to have happy children who are successful and are building life skills along the way; like how to make a friend, be a friend, and keep a friend.

One recent example of how Billie Jean and her team bring their classroom to life is by bringing in a composter and measuring worms together as a lesson. HNS continues to revamp and bring in more outside enrichment such as the local librarian, parents who volunteer as guest readers, firefighter families, and more.
