



# NEW Mental Wellness Hub with Mental Makeover offered this Saturday from 10-4 during Arts Fest at FBC Beverly!

Beverly Main Streets announced that for the first time, Arts Fest Beverly will feature a Mental Wellness Hub in partnership with Mental Makeover. The Mental Wellness Hub will provide social emotional activities for children and adults who may struggle with noise and stimulation that can occur given the scale of Arts Fest Beverly. The Mental Wellness Hub will be available for the duration of Arts Fest Beverly at First Baptist Church (221 Cabot Street). Mental Makeover leadership and ambassadors will be on hand to assist with activities. The Mental Wellness Hub is supported through the Mass Cultural Council's Universal Participation Innovation Fund to plan and implement accessibility systems within organizations.

"Arts Fest Beverly is our signature event and plays a major role in our efforts to build community in Beverly. We are excited to offer the Mental Wellness Hub to better support children and families that would like to attend, but might require additional support due to the overwhelming nature of festivals. We see this as the first of



many opportunities to provide specialized support to members of our community that may need it." shared Beverly Main Streets Executive Director Erin Truex.

Emily Longeran, Co-President of Mental Makeover, shares, "When we started Mental Makeover, we had one goal in mind: to be more proactive than reactive when it came to talking about mental health. Throughout our journey, we've developed two boxes as part of our programming. Our "Understanding Emotions" education box is designed to teach elementary-aged youth about mental health in an engaging way and initiate genuine conversations between trusted adults and youth. Our "The World Needs You Here" support box is filled with resources, coping tools, and personal notes from us as creators to support individuals struggling with their mental health, especially those facing barriers to accessing services due to long waitlists or affordability."
